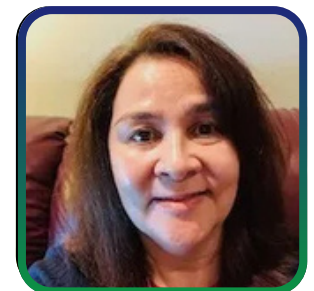

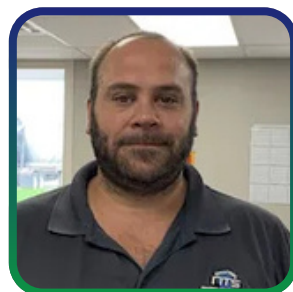

Earth Day!

On April 26th, 2025 we celebrated earth day with a couple of activities, we brought **Remake Learning Days** to Armourdale and conducted our annual clean-up. We cleaned a selected area in the neighborhood with the assistance of the Key Club members as volunteers and other community members. Thanks to the 37 volunteers who participated!



ARA Summer Camp

This year ARA welcomed 22 kids who joined the camp, we continue to host this program that engages children in learning life skills, building team spirit while **exploring nature, Arts, STEM, Sports, Safety, and Intro to Financial Ed (new!)**

Mr. & Mrs. Reed bring lots of fun and structure for these young kids. We added extra activities and everyone left with a lot of joy! Our youth continued to participate in learning and fun fieldtrips as they contributed in the Armourdale Artworks Initiative completing a survey and in sidewalk painting activity outside of their school. Special mention to Heart of America US Volleyball for allowing us to utilize their space as a place for this camp.



Hispanic Heritage Festival

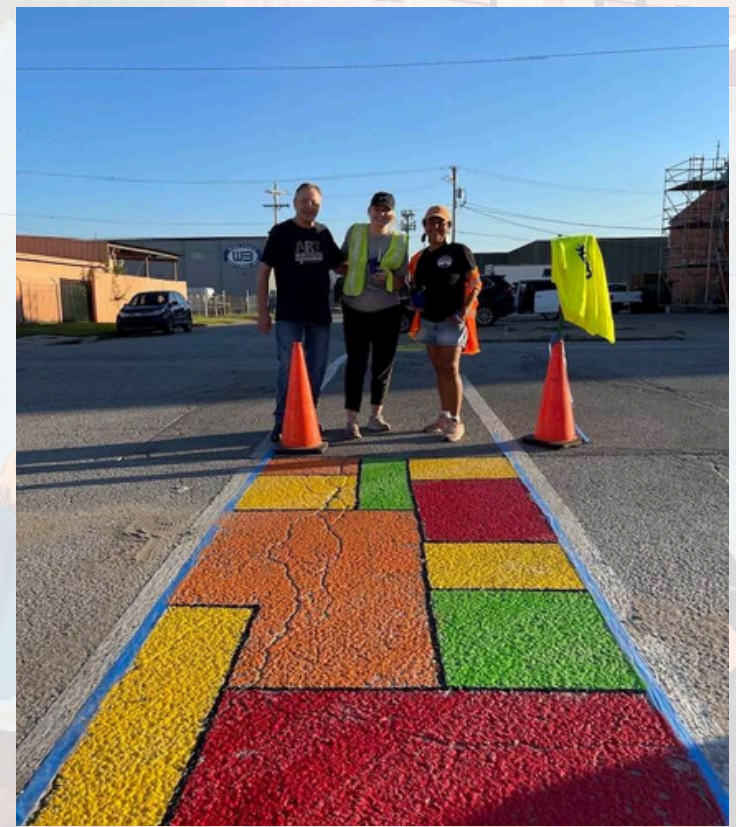
ARA and John Fiske Elementary celebrated Hispanic Heritage Month on October 4th at Shawnee Park. This event saw **150 participants and 28 volunteers** while promoting community connectedness in the neighborhood.



Armourdale Artworks Initiative

This project is divided in phases to include the arts as part of our education programs and to add beautification to the community. This year our summer camp participants completed sidewalk paint at John Fiske Elementary as part of a PILOT phase.

For Phase I we hosted an activation day where **37 community member volunteers** joined to bring vibrant public art to the neighborhood, painting a mural, 10 sidewalk art designs inspired by Loteria Mexicana, chosen by local residents to reflect the neighborhood's culture. A newly designed crosswalk connected to the mural space with colors representing different parts of the area. **The Mural about the 1951 Flood** was recently unveiled in a ceremony with **110 attendees**. This mural is to honor the strength, loss, and determination that shaped our neighborhood. The artwork stands as a tribute to the Armourdale community's ability to rise, rebuild, and move forward. The mural was performed by Jose Faus whose talent is demonstrated at 631 Kansas Avenue for all to view.



Adopt an Angel

This annual program continues to grow thanks to all of our sponsors, in addition to our many sponsors we were able to introduce the **Farm2Families** project in Armourdale. This year **77 children recieved gifts** and **22 families obtained free food**.



Section 2 Economic Growth

Business Luncheons

ARA members attended a couple of meetings that informed about important topics to the community. This year presentations included two topics:

“Homeless: What It Is & What It Isn’t presented by Cross-lines” and “Development Shaping Armourdale and Wyandotte County” presented by Wyandotte Economic Development Corporation.”

During these lunch meetings we share activities organized by ARA and recognize sponsors and donors while we learn with new businesses that join the ARA. Combined attendance is of **74 participants.**



Summer Youth Employment

BPU has made this program possible for youth ages 14-18. This year we partnered with Argentine Betterment Corporation and Rosedale Development Association to provide tools needed before entering the workforce. Youth visited local business to see work environments and were interviewed. We closed the program attending the Future Leaders Day event hosted by BPU. ARA hosted **10 students** who after training performed real jobs in the Armourdale neighborhood. This was a 7 weeks program.



Youth Leadership Week!

This pilot project hosted **8 high school** and **4 middle school students** during the spring break. The program focused on time management, effective communication, goal setting, teaching basic financial principles, promoting entrepreneurial thinking, and preparing for Real-World Employment.

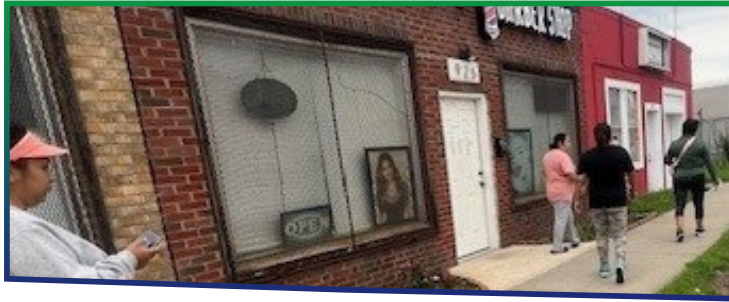

We collaborated with **Heart of America Volleyball** and brought free volleyball clinics to our area along with free play time!



Annual 5K Run & Walk

Our first ever 5K Run & Walk event occurred in Armourdale. We saw **participants from different cities** including Armourdale and John Fiske families.
